For 27 years, PALOA Musical Theater has been bringing the music, drama and spectacle of Broadway-style shows to the Olympic Peninsula. Every summer thousands of PALOA theater patrons are transported to exotic locations such as the Imperial court of Siam in the *King and I*, Never Never Land in *Peter Pan* or to distant time periods like the Middle Ages in *Once Upon a Mattress* or the gold fields of California in *Paint Your Wagon*.

Thousands of people have come to expect the quality that PALOA Musical Theater represents. These productions showcase the finest vocal and instrumental talents as well as the skilled handiwork of countless designers, builders, painters, stitchers and more.

PALOA not only provides welcome, wholesome family entertainment, but also provides real life experience, training and skill development to people of all ages by giving them practical experience in the theater.

THE PALOA CENTER

In 2007 construction began on the PALOA Center. This multi-purpose facility now houses our set and costume shop, costume and prop storage, tech equipment storage, two rehearsal spaces, a conference room and allows us to build and rehearse our



shows all on one campus. The space at the Center has allowed for many classes in set building, fencing and audition workshops as well as be an effective venue to rent costumes to the public and share with local theater companies.

Though much of the main construction is completed, there still remains a great deal of finishing work at the Center that is holding back the full use and possibilities that this facility represents. Your timely support of money and in-kind services will help us to quickly reach our goal of completing the Center and realizing its full potential

Once completed, the Center will become a resource that other local arts organizations will be able to use in mounting their productions, whether availing themselves of our costume inventory, contracting use in our set shop, or rehearsing on our practice stage.

PALOA YEAR ROUND

Perhaps the greatest benefit the Center has provided is the means for PALOA to expand beyond a summer main stage program to a year round artistic presence. PALOA now features a full season with a fall second stage musical

partnership with Peninsula College, an early winter Musical Dinner Theater Revue and our Summer Main Stage show with various special appearances at local functions and special events.

In addition, PALOA is continuing its education outreach program to train and equip future performance and stage technicians through sponsored dance classes, fencing classes and a Theater Practicum study program with Peninsula College.

Presenting Community Theater of this caliber and quality takes the whole community.

OUR NEED FOR YOUR HELP

Performing arts groups across the country have a difficult time funding their productions and programs through ticket sales alone and we are no exception. Ticket sales provide a large part of our Main Stage budget but in many cases, ticket sales cover only 40-50% of a performing arts group's expenses.
